## Share Buyback Programme

As part of Informa's Capital Allocation programme, the Company has a commitment to delivering consistent shareholder returns, including through share buybacks. In 2025, the Company has committed a minimum of £200m to its share buyback programme.

On 09 April 2025, the Company purchased 544,330 ordinary shares for cancellation through Morgan Stanley & Co. International plc at an average price of 642.95 pence per share. The highest and lowest purchase price paid per share were 652.20 and 634.40 respectively, with the aggregate details of shares purchased by trading venue as outlined in the table below:

Following settlement of the above purchases and cancellation of the purchased ordinary shares, the Company's total number of ordinary shares in issue, and its total voting rights, will be 1,320,404,325 ordinary shares. The Company does not hold any shares in Treasury.
